Blackburn High is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Blackburn High's parent payment arrangements for 2021.

The students of Blackburn High School are privileged to attend one of Victoria's most successful Secondary schools. Underlying the success and quality of the wide-ranging academic and co-curricular programs available to meet the diverse needs of our 1400 students, is the voluntary financial support that ensures we have the materials and facilities to run programs successfully.

Blackburn High School Council and its Finance Committee work closely with the Principal Team and Business Manager to set recommended student fees that meets the budgetary requirements of the school. This ensures that the provision of student wellbeing and support programs, major and minor upgrades to buildings, grounds, and classroom technology is made available for the benefit and enjoyment of your and all other children.

Financial Support for Families

Blackburn High School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)
- Second hand Uniform Shop (on school Premise and open 2 mornings per week)
- Second hand Book Sale (on school Premise and held at the end of year and beginning of year)
- States Schools Relief.

Payment Methods

Blackburn High School will provide parents with early notification of annual payment requests, a minimum of 6 weeks prior to the students' start of their new academic year.

Blackburn High School has a number of payment methods including;

- Cash/Cheque
- BPay
- EFTPOS
- Instalment Plans and Payments via the School's Parent Portal

In most cases, the school will offer a payment plan for particular requests ie Camps, Essential Student Learning Items and Music tuition. Where no payment plan is offered the minimum requirement of 6 weeks' notice will be given to families ie for Optional items such as chosen high cost electives, excursions and incursions.

Refunds

Our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally, we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party. For example, camp costs when a child becomes unwell and cannot attend in circumstances where the payment has already been made or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school.

Please note that Music Tuition is a whole year commitment.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
