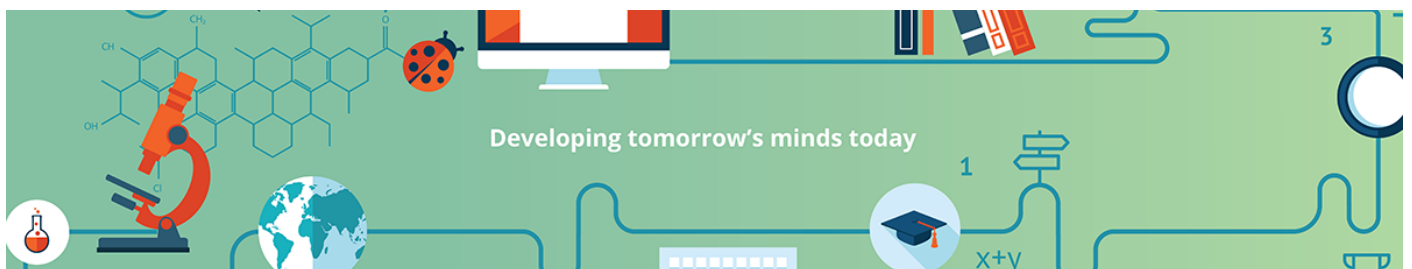

Music Excellence

Debating News

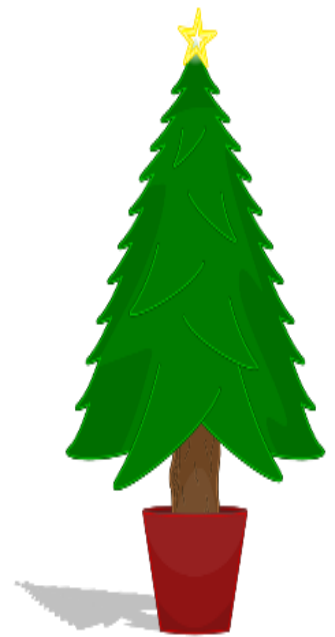
Dunlop House

The primary school audiences of various grades enjoyed the performances. According to feedback received the performance was 'terrific' and a 'real treat'.

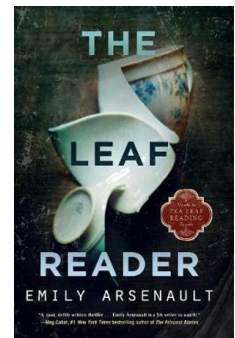
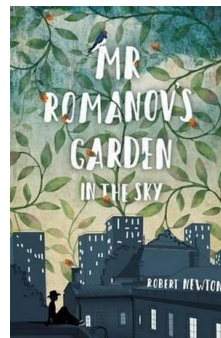
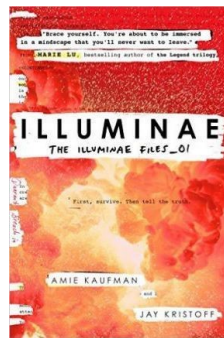
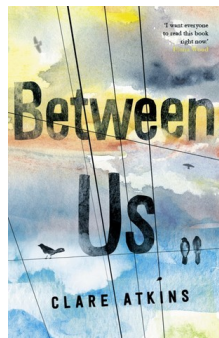
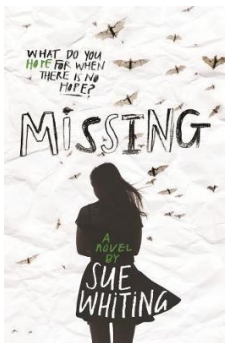

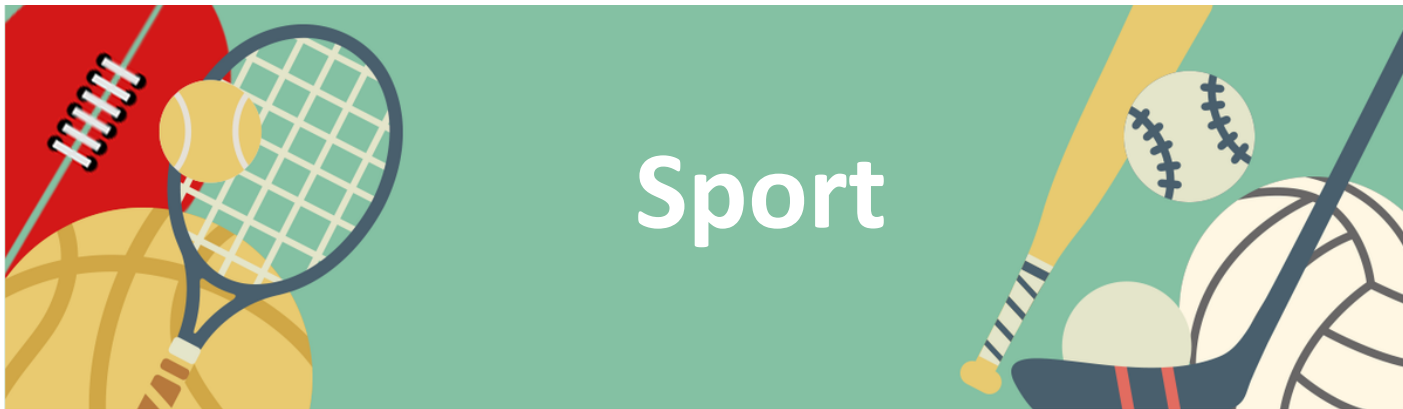
FIVE YA BOOKS TO READ THIS TERM
